Originally the Queensland Agricultural College, the campus was established in 1897. The CSIRO Cooper Laboratory, established on campus in the 1930s, is a major field site of the organisation’s wheat improvement program involving scientists from the molecular biology labs in Canberra through to those in Brisbane researching germplasm enhancement and evaluation. Jim Galletly, formerly a lecturer at the Gatton campus, has made a career-long study of Lockyer Creek, the main water supply for the district and the impact those supplies have had on crop production. Those crops include potatoes, onions, cucurbits, beetroot and other vegetables, citrus and other tree fruits, lucerne as well as wheat, barley and sorghum.</p> |

The site accommodates the corporate executive team and organisation-wide support services. There are approximately 50 staff located on site. BSES undertakes a substantial program on genetic modification of sugarcane, which is supported by the CRC for Sugar Industry Innovation through Biotechnology. Outcomes from the GM program will be canes producing bioplastics, derivatives of sucrose, and novel approaches to pest and disease resistance. New tissue culture based propagation systems for sugarcane are being developed. Molecular markers associated with performance traits are being used for introgression of novel genes, and for genotyping the identity of clones. Soil and water analyses are undertaken in support of productivity and natural resource management research, and the site provides the majority of the organisation’s capability in sugar quality research. Receipt and supply of all germplasm is managed through the quarantine facility on site.</p> <p>NSW Sugar Industry/Tweed Valley:</p> <p>Over 70% of the sugar cane in the Tweed Valley is grown on acid sulfate soils. We will visit a research site at Robert Quirk’s farm and see how the sugar industry manages the problem and how it worked with government to achieve self-regulation for managing these soils. The Cropping Systems trial compares several row configurations using controlled traffic to conventional cane farming methods. The new cropping systems also incorporate a soybean rotation. Under the NSW Sugar Industry’s proposed co-generation project, pre-harvest firing of cane will cease and the entire standing crop will be harvested and transported to the mill. There the cane leaves will be separated and used as fuel for generating green power along with the surplus cane fibre. The two proposed plants will each generate 30 MW of green power per year.</p> |

Originally known as Lang Park, Suncorp Stadium has a long history as one of Queensland's premier sporting venues. It was re-built in 2003 as a rectangular playing field surrounded by seating for up to 52,500 spectators in stands around the perimeter close to the action in a 'cauldron-like' atmosphere. Suncorp is used for local and international football matches, including Rugby League, Rugby Union and soccer. It was one of the venues around Australia selected to stage last year's World Cup of Rugby. The playing surface is bermudagrass, and is oversown with ryegrass during the cooler months. Like all major sporting venues in Brisbane, Suncorp Stadium is managed by the Major Sports Facility Authority.</p> <p>Redlands Park – a 66 hectare research centre operated by the Queensland Department of Primary Industries and Fisheries (DPI&F) – is testimony to the changing priorities for agricultural research over the past 50 years. Originally a centre for fruit and vegetable research in the former 'salad bowl' region just outside Brisbane, it is now located among the urban sprawl on the eastern edge of Brisbane and dedicated to amenity (lifestyle) horticulture. A major activity area at Redlands Park is the growing turf research program, which was initiated less than 5 years ago. The adaptation and management of warm-season turfgrasses in relation to environmental and user-related stresses (water, salinity, shade, temperature, nutrition, wear, chemical use) is a major focus of current work at Redlands, and their living collection of more than 130 warm-season turfgrass varieties is always a point of interest for visitors.</p> <p>Rochedale Turf is one of Queensland's larger-scale sod producers, with 140 hectares under cultivation. The tour will visit Rochedale's main sod farm, which is located on the southern outskirts of Brisbane. The company markets a range of warm-season grasses to a diverse local clientele from homeowners and land developers through to sportsfields, golf courses and other sports venues. It also has contracts for the supply of turf to local and state government agencies, and is moving into export sales. Rochedale Turf's growing business is supported by its expanding range of public and proprietary varieties.</p> |
